Achieving Progress in Friendship and Cooperation between Myanmar and India, High-level Myanmar Delegation led by President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing Sumptuously Welcomed Back by Public



A high-level Myanmar delegation led by President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing paid an official visit to India at the invitation of Indian Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. In the evening of 3 June, the President-led delegation departed from Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport in Mumbai. The delegation was seen off at the airport by Maharashtra State Government Minister Mr Sawant and state officials, Myanmar Ambassador to India U Zaw Oo, the Myanmar Consul-General in Kolkata and other officials.

During the visit to India, the President held discussions with the President of India, conducted bilateral meetings with

the Prime Minister of India, and also met cabinet members of the Indian government, state leaders and representatives of business organizations to discuss matters that benefit both the country and people. Moreover, he visited historic landmark sites and industrial, port and energy project locations, and openly exchanged views on enhancing cooperation between the two governments and peoples in various sectors, including economic, religious, cultural, social and tourism sectors.

On arrival back at the Nay Pyi Taw Airport, the high-level Myanmar delegation led by the President was welcomed home by Vice-President Nan Ni Ni Aye, Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker U Khin Yi, Amy-



otha Hluttaw Speaker U Aung Lin Dwe, Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services General Ye Win Oo, Union ministers, the Nay Pyi Taw Council Chairman, the commander of the Nay Pyi Taw Command, officials from the Embassy of the India to Myanmar and the Military Attaché Office.

The relevant officials of India-Myanmar Friendship Association, Indian dance troupes, traditional dance troupes, artistes and residents took positions from the ladder of the aircraft to the VIP lounge of the airport and the roundabout to the Tatmadaw Airport to welcome home the high-level Myanmar delegation led by the President for praising his efforts during the trip to India to grab opportunities of cooperation between the people and businesspersons in enhancement of agriculture, livestock breeding, economic, trade, academic and tourism sectors for the sake of Myanmar. They honoured the Myanmar delegation with loud cheers and great enthusiasm by holding the vinyl posters bearing **“May the friendship between India**

and Myanmar be long-lasting. May the comprehensive strategic cooperation between India and Myanmar continue to expand across various sectors. Warmly welcome to President Min Aung Hlaing, who has endeavoured for the all-round development of Myanmar”. They also waved miniature flags of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar and India and chanted, **“May Myanmar-India cooperation achieve lasting success. May President Min Aung Hlaing, who is striving for the nation, religion, and faith, be in good health. May they be firm and enduring.”** They also warmly welcome President Min Aung Hlaing and party with LED boards bearing record photos of the trip of the President and letters **“Warmly welcome, President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing.”**

On arrival back in Nay Pyi Taw, the President replied to queries raised by media . The President’s responses to the media were as follows:



- My visit was undertaken based on the existing friendship and amity between Myanmar and India. During the trip, I met and held discussions with Indian leaders, including the President and Prime Minister Mr Modi. I also held a separate meeting with the Minister of External Affairs.
- We were able to discuss expanding bilateral economic cooperation and investment across various sectors. Agreements were reached on a number of areas, and joint statements were issued.
- If stakeholders along the Indian border genuinely wish to see the country prosper, they need to cooperate with the State, pursue cooperation through peaceful means, and make a concerted effort. They should reflect on their approaches and work towards the betterment of our country.
- Similarly, individuals and organizations in other areas where stability has been

affected for various reasons should reconsider their positions in the country's interest. If they cooperate through peaceful means and, in accordance with democratic principles, to work for the betterment of the nation, the country's progress will not be delayed, and its continued advancement is assured.

- With the school opening, if all school-aged children attend school and we dedicate a certain amount of time to strive alongside educational advancement, I expect we will successfully reach our envisioned social goals.

The trip was successful. There will naturally be a variety of comments and opinions about it, but many of them have been positive. The trip was well worth the effort invested in it. At Bodh Gaya, I prayed for the peace and development of the country. I also prayed that the public may make a peaceful living with healthy minds and bodies, reports say.

President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing Delivers a Speech at Myanmar-India Business Dialogue



The Myanmar-India Business Dialogue took place at The Taj Mahal Palace Hotel in Mumbai, India on 3 June, addressed by President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing, who was on an official visit to India. Also present were union ministers and other members of the delegation led by the President, officials of the Indian Government, the Myanmar ambassador to India, the Indian ambassador to Myanmar and officials, the patron and members of UMFCCI, the chairman and members of the Myanmar-India Friendship Association, invited entrepreneurs from Myanmar and India, and honoured guests.

President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing delivered

a Speech at the Dialogue as follows:

- The President expressed his pleasure at having the opportunity to visit Mumbai, widely known as "The Gateway of India." The city is also home to UNESCO World Heritage Sites and houses a large number of historical landmarks.
- Indeed, his current official visit will serve as a strategic driving force to promote India's cooperation, trade, investment, and value chains with Myanmar, in alignment with India's Act East Policy and Neighbourhood First Policy.
- Following many years of political instability under various circumstances, Myanmar now enjoys favorable conditions to restore and maintain stability under a



democratically elected government that emerged from the 2025 elections.

- As Myanmar restores political stability and cooperates with India, the latter will find an abundance of new opportunities.
- “In this regard, I chose India as my first foreign destination to enhance bilateral economic and trade cooperation shortly after taking presidential office,” he said.
- India stands as Myanmar’s fourth-largest trading partner. The two nations have already established numerous business agreements, historically conducting border trade through relevant checkpoints.
- According to statistics issued in Myanmar, exports to India reached US\$-1.326 billion in fiscal year 2025–2026, while India's annual export value to Myanmar stood between US\$- 600 million and 800 million.
- The President stated, “As the bilateral trade volume was just over US\$-2 billion, I was able to initiate a plan to boost trade volume to US\$-3 billion in the first phase, and US\$-5 billion in the second stage during my discussions with the Indian Prime Minister.” He noted that a direct Kyat-Rupee settlement mechanism was reached in the trade sector.
- As Myanmar seeks to purchase more Indian goods, India should boost its exports—especially iron and steel, cement, medicines, fuel, and solar panels.
- Conversely, Myanmar aims to export more beans and pulses, oil crops, fisheries, forest products, textiles, rice, and rubber products to India.
- Given India's advanced healthcare and education sectors, he emphasized that there are significant opportunities for India to invest in these two fields within Myanmar.
- India’s investment in Myanmar amounts to over US\$-94 billion, making it the 11th largest investor among countries investing in Myanmar. Therefore,



the President extended an invitation for more investment to be made in the country.

- Particularly in sectors such as agriculture and live-stock, oil and natural gas, industry, transport, telecommunications, and services.
- India is a leading country in the information, digital, and advanced technology sectors, and invited high-tech industries from India to come and invest in Myanmar.
- Regarding pharmaceuticals, India is a global leader in pharmaceutical production and that most of Myanmar's pharmaceutical imports are sourced from India. Therefore, the President encouraged investment in pharmaceutical manufacturing within Myanmar.

- Arrangements would be made to facilitate faster processes for trade and investment.

Indian entrepreneurs discussed the operating investments by Indian businesspersons in Myanmar, expressing thanks to the President for his encouragement to further promotion of investment and trading process between the two countries, cooperation in technology, investment, and bio energy production sectors, and further promotion of cooperation in manufacturing of necessary machinery and fertilizers for mining and agricultural sectors. In response to the discussions presented, the President invited investment from India into Myanmar, including in bioenergy. The President also extended an invitation for investment in the bioenergy sector. The President underlined that Myanmar is a



country that prioritizes the agricultural sector and therefore welcomed investment in projects that can bring real and effective benefits to agriculture. The President further added additional remarks on other necessary matters.

After the meeting, the President and party visited the Gateway of India, Mumbai. Officials welcomed them and conducted them round the building.

The Gateway of India, Mumbai, is a world-famous historic monument located on the Mumbai beach, India. Construction began in 1915 and was completed in 1924. The structure's architecture is of the Indo-Saracenic style, which blends 16th century Gujarati Islamic and Hindu traditional architectural elements. It is built using yellow basalt stone, and the central arch rises to a height of approximately 85 feet. The

Gateway of India is regarded as an iconic landmark of Mumbai, often referred to as “the Taj Mahal of Mumbai”, and remains a major tourist attraction visited with great interest by travelers from around the world.

The President and party arrived at the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport where they were welcomed by officials and viewed round the work procedures of the airport. After hearing the clarification about the airport, the President asked them about things what he wanted to know, reports say.

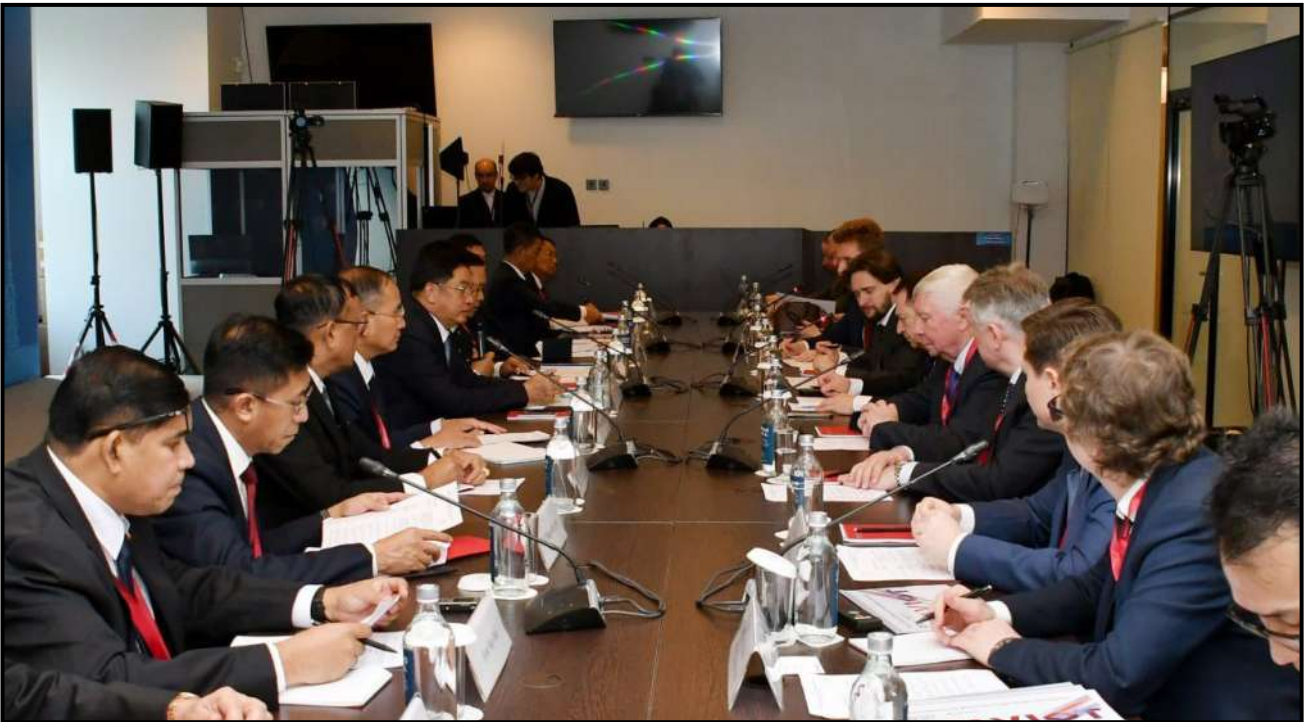

Speaker of Pyidaungsu Hluttaw and Amyotha Hluttaw U Aung Lin Dwe Meets Joint Bill and Public Accounts Committees



Speaker of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw and the Amyotha Hluttaw U Aung Lin Dwe met with members of the Joint Bill Committee and the Joint Public Accounts Committee at its building in Nay Pyi Taw on 3 June.

During the meeting, Speaker of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw and the Amyotha Hluttaw U Aung Lin Dwe discussed as follows:

- The formation and operation of joint committees is necessary because there is insufficient time during Hluttaw sessions to examine in detail the contents of each bill and its impacts on the State and citizens. Therefore, Hluttaw committees are formed to conduct detailed scrutiny of legislation, formulate recommendations, analyze the provisions of bills, and engage in direct discussions and decision-making with relevant departments and organizations, experts, and civil society organizations.
- Committee members shall have the right to freely speak, discuss, and vote in committee meetings, provided that such actions do not contradict the provisions of the Constitution and Hluttaw laws. As a Joint Bill Committee, all types of bills except those that have been agreed upon by both Hluttaws must be reviewed and analyzed by the committee, and the committee is required to submit its comments and observations. These include bills that are initially debated in the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw, bills on which the two Hluttaws have reached differing views, and bills returned by the President with comments.

- The Joint Public Accounts Committee is also required, under Section 100 (b) of the Constitution, to conduct a detailed examination of the annual national development plan and the annual estimated budgets that are to be discussed and decided upon in the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw. In accordance with Rule 131 of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Rules and the provisions of the Union Budget Law, the committee shall scrutinize matters relating to state revenues and expenditures based on the report of the Auditor-General of the Union. In carrying out such scrutiny, it shall examine whether the projected revenues submitted to the Hluttaw have been fully collected; whether the authorized expenditures are being spent in accordance with financial rules and procedures for the designated purposes; whether the funds are being used effectively; and whether there are any instances of wastage, leakage, damage, losses, misuse, or misappropriation in the implementation of projects. If necessary, the committee may conduct field inspections with the approval of the Speaker.
- Members of the Joint Committee are required to clearly understand their duties and responsibilities and to exercise caution to ensure that they do not act beyond their authority.
- Joint committees should pay special attention to the fact that, in the course of reviewing and reporting on bills and reports, inviting and questioning responsi-

ble officials from ministries and organizations is part of the Hluttaw's oversight function and is undertaken solely for the purpose of gathering information to ensure more effective and successful implementation of its work.

- Committee members are required to thoroughly and carefully study the Hluttaw Law, rules and regulations, as well as all other related laws.

Chairman of the two joint committees, Deputy Speaker Jeng Phang Naw Taung stated that the joint committees serve as key supporting bodies to ensure the approval of bills in the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw and to scrutinize and endorse matters related to the national development plan, budget, and taxation. He noted that the roles and functions of the joint committees are comprehensively defined in the Union Assembly Law and rules and regulations; therefore, committee members are advised to study and understand them thoroughly. He further urged members to cooperate closely in order to effectively and fully carry out their duties during the five-year term of office. Later, the Permanent-Secretary of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw clarified the responsibilities of the two joint committees, reports say.

- **Committee members shall have the right to freely speak, discuss, and vote in committee meetings, provided that such actions do not contradict the provisions of the Constitution and Hluttaw laws.**
- **Members of the Joint Committee are required to clearly understand their duties and responsibilities and to exercise caution to ensure that they do not act beyond their authority.**
- **Joint committees should pay special attention to the fact that, in the course of reviewing and reporting on bills and reports, inviting and questioning responsible officials from ministries and organizations is part of the Hluttaw's oversight function and is undertaken solely for the purpose of gathering information to ensure more effective and successful implementation of its work.**

Second-day Meeting of Second Regular Session of Third Pyithu Hluttaw Held



The second-day meeting of the second regular session of the Third Pyithu Hluttaw continued at its convention hall at the Hluttaw Complex in Nay Pyi Taw at 10 am of 3 June.

- Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker U Khin Yi announced that, out of 351 Pyithu Hluttaw representatives entitled to attend the second day of the second regular ses-

sion of the Third Pyithu Hluttaw, 349 were present at today's meeting, resulting in an attendance rate of 99.43 per cent. Accordingly, it was declared that the meeting had achieved quorum and was duly opened.

- Representatives from relevant constituencies discussed the matters regarding the issue concerning residents of

Aunglan Township, Magway Region, who are reportedly required to pay fees at two checkpoints when travelling within their own township; the matter of whether short-term and long-term measures can be implemented to upgrade the road from the inter-district road in Tatkon Township, Nay Pyi Taw, to Thit Seint Pin Village into a gravel road; the matter of restoring the seasonal natural beauty of Taungthaman Lake and U Bein Bridge in Amarapura Township, Mandalay Region, in a harmonious manner; the matter of providing electricity to wards in Kalay Town and surrounding rural areas, enabling multiple cropping, and undertaking rehabilitation and renovation works of the Yarzagyo multipurpose dam; the matter of providing farmers with sufficient loans, agricultural machinery such as tractors, crop storage facilities, technologies, and the creation of markets to support agricultural development and improve farmers' livelihoods; the matter of whether the Wantaung Village self-help

earthen dam in Moinlu Village-tract, Mongyang Township, can be upgraded into a masonry concrete dam; and the formation of a commission to regulate and stabilize the prices of agricultural, field, and orchard produce.

- The Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker submitted the formation of a committee on domestic and international non-governmental organizations with 15 members, and duties will be assigned to U Thet Pon from Sagaing Constituency as chair and U Tun Lwin from the ChaungU Constituency as secretary.

The second-day meeting of the second regular session of the Third Pyithu Hluttaw was adjourned, and it will continue for the third day at 10 am of 5 June, it is reported.

Second-day Meeting of Second Regular Session of Third Amyotha Hluttaw Held



The second-day meeting of the second regular session of the Third Amyotha Hluttaw was held at its convention hall at the Hluttaw Complex in Nay Pyi Taw on 3 June. Out of a total of 209 Amyotha Hluttaw representatives, 208 attended the session. Accordingly, it was declared that the meeting had achieved quorum and was duly opened.

During the meeting, Deputy Minister for Electricity and Energy U Aye Kyaw replied to the questions raised by representatives from relevant constituencies as follows:

- **Regarding the question on whether there is any plan to reduce the electricity charges collected under the so-**

lar power distribution project in Hkamti, Sagaing Region, the Deputy Minister said that as solar energy alone is insufficient to provide a 24-hour electricity supply to Hkamti, the solar power plant was constructed with a hybrid system. It is necessary to use diesel generators during periods when sunlight is insufficient. Electricity availability in Hkamti would depend primarily on the amount of sunlight received, making it impossible to provide uninterrupted 24-hour power to critical facilities. In order to reduce the electricity tariff to K900 per unit, there are plans to renegotiate the agreement governing the distribution and sale of electricity in Hkamti.



- **Regarding the question on whether there is a plan to extend electricity supply to Hsihsonganaing, Sabal Kone, Taungthu Kone and Taungtate Villages in Kyaukgu Village-tract, Indaw Town, Lawksawk Township, Shan State (South),** the Deputy Minister explained that although the power lines for those villages have already been constructed with funds provided by the Shan State Government, electricity has not yet been distributed due to the capacity limitations of the existing power plant. To facilitate the construction of the Zawgyi 2-Kyaukgu 66 kV transmission line and substation, the project has been included in the Union budget starting from the 2027 2028 FY and will be implemented subject to the availability of funding. Electricity can be distributed to the four villages only after the completion. In addition, the construction of the required 11 kV distribution lines and 11/0.4 kV transformers in the four villages will be carried out in phases using
- Shan State Government funds, in line with the completion schedule of the transmission line and substation projects.
- **Regarding the question on whether there is a plan to implement a solar power project to ensure a 24-hour electricity supply in Manaung Township, Rakhine State,** in order to ensure a 24-hour electricity supply on Manaung Island in Rakhine State, a plan has been drawn up to construct solar power plants in three phases based on field surveys conducted jointly by the Rakhine State Government and KOICA of the Republic of Korea, with the aim of providing electricity supply. As the first phase of the project, a 0.5 MW Solar Power Plant (Solar+Battery+Diesel Generator system) was constructed in Ohnmaw Village, Manaung Island. The project was funded through a donation from POSCO Daewoo Co Ltd. Electricity has been distributed to five urban wards and four surrounding villages since November 2019. As the second

phase of the project, to supply electricity to 62 villages and 6,241 households, construction of power lines, distribution lines, and transformers has already been completed in advance using the Rakhine State Government budget since the 2015-2016 financial year. The remaining work involves the construction of a 2.5 MW Solar Power Plant (Solar + Battery + Diesel Generator system), and it will be implemented beginning in the 2027-28 FY using Rakhine State Government funds.

- **Regarding the question on whether there is a plan to install solar-powered streetlights in Kyaukpyu Township, Rakhine State**, out of approximately 2,000 streetlights, around 1,000 have already been installed. The remaining solar streetlights will be installed depending on budget allocations from the Rakhine State Government.

Later, Amyotha Hluttaw Speaker U Aung Lin Dwe informed the Amyotha Hluttaw about the formation of the non-governmental internal and external organi-

zations committee comprising 15 members with Daw Mie Mie Kyaw Tun from the Kachin State Constituency 4 as Chair and U Aung Chit Lwin from the Sagaing Region Constituency 2 as Secretary. Union Minister for Home Affairs Lt-Gen Nyunt Win Swe submitted the Anti-Online Scam Law and explained that, if enacted, an Anti-Scam Centre would be established, and banks, financial institutions, and the telecommunications sector would be connected through an API system in order to effectively prevent fraudulent activities. Bill Committee Secretary U Zin Min Htet read out the findings and remarks of the committee on the Anti-Online Scam Bill. The Amyotha Hluttaw Speaker announced that, in relation to the draft law on combating online fraud, any Hluttaw representatives may submit amendments to the bill if they wish. The second-day meeting of the second regular session of the Third Amyotha Hluttaw was adjourned, and it will continue for the third day on 8 June, it is reported.

Eight Members of Terrorist Groups Return to Legal Fold along with Weapons/Ammunition after understanding Peace Process by the State and the Tatmadaw



The Government is extending the invitations to those, who are now the members of various armed terrorist groups including PDF group, to return to legal fold, and providing them with necessary assistance to those who have returned to legal fold. In this context, eight male members of KNLA, ABSDF, NMSP (splinter) and PDF groups returned to legal fold after they came to understand peace process by the State and the Tatmadaw.

- On 3 June, a total of eight terrorist members: one member from Kyainn Seikgyi Township; one member from Hpa-An Township, Kayin State; one members from Kyaikmaraw Township, Mon State; one member from Insein Township, Yangon Region; one member from Nyaungdon Township, Ayeyawady

Region; one member from Ye Township, Mon State; one member from Chanayethazan Township, Mandalay Region; and one member from Kalaw Township, Shan State (South) returned to legal fold, together with one carbine rifle, AK-47 rifle, one M4 A1 rifle, one SUR-M9 A-2 YSRA 1YSO1-2419684 pistol, 150 bullet rounds, six magazines, one walkie-talkie device (with charger), and a pair of handcuffs. Then, the State Chief Minister, the commander and other officials presented rewards and assistance: 15 million kyats for three automatic rifles; 2 million kyats for one pistol; 200,000 kyats for one walkie-talkie device; 2.4 million kyats for terrorist members who entered the legal fold. In total, approximately 19.6 million kyats and other supplies were provided. The



returnees were entrusted to their parents and guardians.

- From 2021 to 3 June 2026, a total of 3,441 members (3,029 males and 412 females) from the Ethnic Armed Organizations and the PDF groups have already returned the legal fold.

Those PDF members, who have returned to legal fold, were forcibly recruited. They saw the terrorist groups' intimidation, detentions, killings, on innocent civilians and civil servants. Again they came to realize PDF terrorist groups blow up non-military targets of infrastructure, roads, and bridges. They could not tolerate internal discrimination and abuse within the PDF groups, including bullying, torture, kill-

ings, rapes, declining morale, and their inability to withstand the Tatmadaw's offensives. Accordingly, they came to understand peace process by the State and the Tatmadaw, and returned to legal fold as they wished to abandon the armed path, live peacefully within the legal framework, and do service to the State and the people for the losses caused by their actions, it is reported.

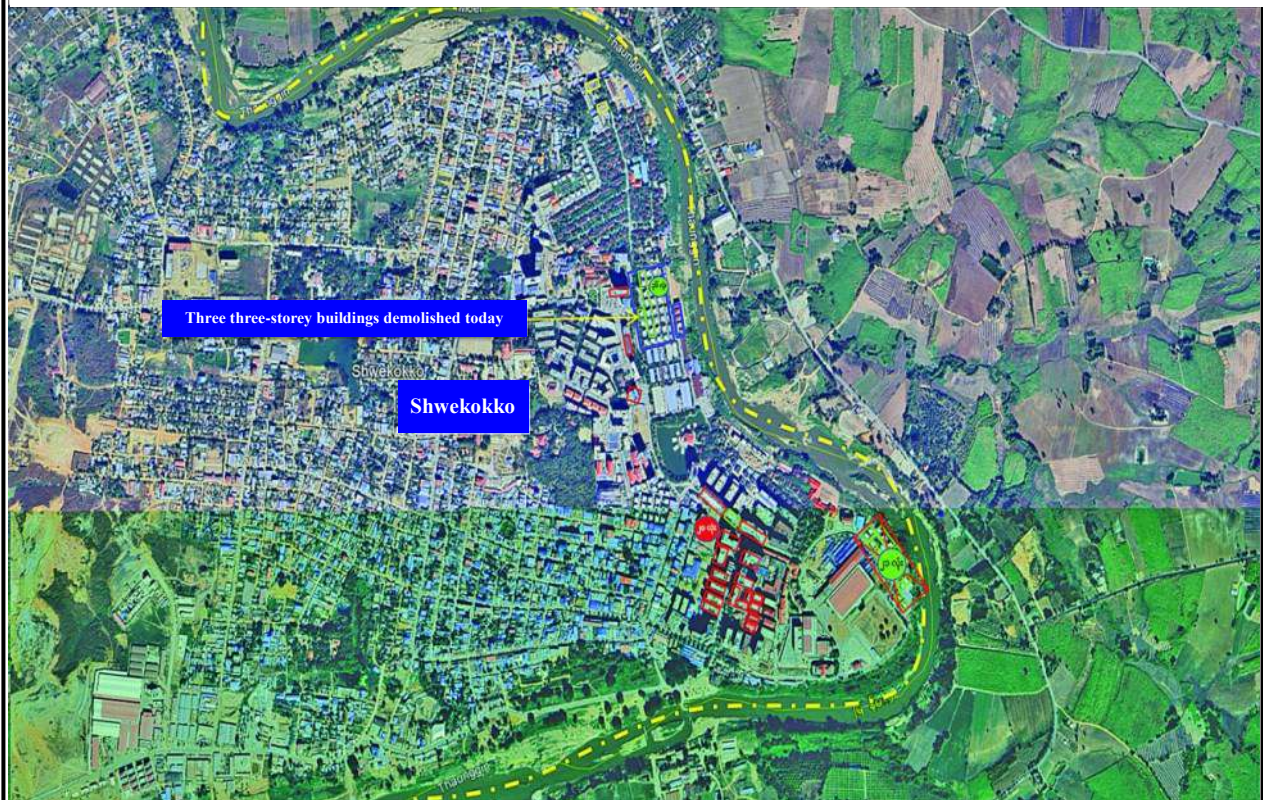

Demolition of Additional Illegal Buildings used for Online Scam and Gambling Operations in Shwe Kokko Area Continues

Demolition of Illegal Buildings in Shwe Kokko Area, Myawady District, Kayin State



The Myanmar Government has set to demolish 77 illegal buildings in Shwe Kokko Area and KK Park. The buildings have been categorized: 57 buildings will be demolished using heavy machinery, and 20 buildings will be destroyed by controlled explosions. Among the 57 designated buildings for demolition, three additional three-storey buildings were demolished using heavy machinery on 3 June. Therefore, 30 buildings altogether have been demolished.

Demolition will continue on the remaining illegal 47 buildings in order. The Government will collaborate not only with local forces but also with the governments of neighbouring countries to prevent online scam and online gambling operations in

Myanmar, assuming the effort as a national responsibility, reports say.
