President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing Attends 2026 World Environment Day



A ceremony to mark the 2026 World Environment Day was held at the Yezin Forestry and Environmental Science University in Nay Pyi Taw on 5 June, with an address by President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing.

During the ceremony, the President delivered remarks as follows:

- The theme being emphasized for this year's World Environment Day is **"A Global Call for Climate Action."** It is necessary to highlight the need for humanity to respond to the adverse impacts and natural disasters caused by climate change and to emphasize that issues related to climate change mitigation must be addressed urgently, with strengthened cooperation and increased collective efforts now more than ever.
- A harmonious balance existed between nature and human beings prior to the onset of industrialization. However, industrial development, alongside the rising use of fossil fuels as a primary energy source, has increased emissions of green-house gases like carbon dioxide and methane, which trap heat in the atmosphere.
- In 2024, global temperatures hit a new record, and the temperature in 2025 was 1.43 degrees Celsius above the 1850–1900 average.
- This fact indicates an annual rise in global temperatures; if the situation goes unchecked, global temperatures could increase by 2.1 to 3.5 degrees Celsius by the end of the century. In addition, rising temperatures will be followed by more severe natural disasters.
- Countries around the world, including Myanmar, face natural disasters every year, resulting in significant economic and social losses.
- The 2026 Climate Risk Index indicates



that Myanmar remains on the list of the top 10 countries most affected by climate change. The country faces a higher risk of rising temperatures, extreme rainfall, storms, and cyclones.

- Myanmar's central dry zone is among the regions recording some of the highest temperatures in the world. Chauk recorded a temperature of 45.3 degrees Celsius in 2025, while this year it reached 44.9 degrees Celsius. Likewise, 12 major towns in the central dry zone recorded temperatures of 41 degrees Celsius or higher.
- While these conditions may be attributed to global warming, it is also true that forest and tree cover in the region is sparse. Studies show that more than 269.8 million trees of various species were planted in Myanmar between 2016 and 2025, which is roughly equivalent to about one million acres. Although trees are used for various purposes to meet human needs, the loss of forests

could be fully offset if every tree harvested were replaced by planting and nurturing another tree.

- In order to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, it is necessary to utilize renewable energy and use energy efficiently, as well as to reforest and conserve forests, and to develop climate-smart agriculture and livestock farming.
- Climate change is an environmental problem being faced globally, and it can only be confronted and resolved through the cooperation of international and regional countries.
- Myanmar has acceded as a Party to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and its related agreements, namely the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement, and has been actively cooperating with the international community in implementing climate change mitigation and response measures.



- As a member state, Myanmar is implementing its Nationally Determined Contributions submitted to the Secretariat of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change in accordance with its commitments under the Paris Agreement to achieve greenhouse gas reduction targets to the best of its ability.
- Everyone is urged to cooperate within their respective sectors to develop green businesses that reduce carbon emissions and support climate change mitigation and environmental conservation across all sectors.
- In alignment with the State's objective, **“Let us protect our environment for the prosperity of the Nation,”** planting and conserving forests and trees is extremely important for environmental conservation and combating climate change.
- Therefore, to reduce deforestation and achieve a forest cover of 50 per cent of the country's area, reserved forests and protected public forests have been expanded to 26.11 per cent of the country's area, and 62 natural areas covering 6.59 percent of the country's area have been established to conserve biodiversity.
- In order to protect against climate change, flooding, and soil erosion, and to prevent natural disasters in established forest areas, areas outside forest reserves, and inland regions, reforestation activities are being carried out with momentum.
- From 2021 to 2025, over 160,000 acres of plantations and over 122 million trees including State-owned plantations, commercial plantations, industrial raw material plantations, water-shed plantations, mangrove plantations, and village fire-wood plantations were planted. This year, 2026, over 21 million trees will be planted on over 30,000 acres nationwide, including State-owned forest



plantations.

- Special greening activities are being collaboratively carried out with related departments in 13 districts of the arid zone, along railways, alongside ASEAN highways and main roads, in the Bagan Ancient Cultural Zone, and in areas around Inle Lake.
- Similarly, 1,715 acres of mangrove plantations and over 2 million trees were planted in coastal areas in 2025, and long-term plans spanning up to 2030 have been drawn up to establish mangrove plantations annually.
- Arrangements have been made to plant 54,180 trees in the Nay Pyi Taw Union Territory, regions and states and townships simultaneously on the same day in national level tree-planting ceremony and pre-monsoon tree-planting ceremonies during the rainy season in 2026.
- To address climate change caused by emission of greenhouse gases, everyone is urged to place emphasis on boosting

green investment and development tasks in relevant sectors that will reduce emission of carbon. Next, the President presented prizes to responsible officials from Hpa-an, Kayin State, which won the ASEAN Sustainably Developed Cities; Thanlyin in Yangon Region and Bawnin New Village in Kalaw Township, Shan State, which won the national-level best environmental management city and village; and rice paddy processing business of Shwe Wah Nadi Agriculture from Nyaungdon Township in Ayeyawady Region, which won the national-level best environmental management enterprise award.

Afterward, Vice-President Daw Nan Ni Ni Aye presented the first, second and third prizes of national-level clean and green schools (high- and middle-school level) to winning schools. Speaker of the Pyithu Hluttaw U Khin Yi presented the first, second and third prizes of national-level clean and green schools (primary level) to winning schools. Speaker of the



Amyotha Hluttaw U Aung Lin Dwe presented prizes to the first, second and third prize winners at the university/college level of the article writing competition marking World Environment Day.

The President and party watched video clips on the messages sent by the UN Secretary-General and the UNEP Executive Director to mark the 2026 World Environment Day, and a knowledge-sharing video clip on 2026 world environmental conservation.

Also present were Vice-President Daw Nan Ni Ni Aye, Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw U Khin Yi, Speaker of Amyotha Hluttaw U Aung Lin Dwe, Commander-in-Chief of

Defence Services General Ye Win Oo, union-level dignitaries and union ministers, senior military officers from the Office of the Commander-in-Chief, members of the Environmental Conservation Committee, departmental personnel, invited guests, award winners, students of Forestry and Environmental Science University and basic education high schools, and officials. The President viewed the exhibitions on the 2026 World Environment Day and asked about the necessary measures regarding the presentations of officials, it is reported.

President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing Inspects Seeds of Crops produced by Pulse Crops Research Section under the Agricultural Research Department of the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation



President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing, accompanied by officials, inspected seeds of crops produced by the Pulse Crops Research Section under the Agricultural Re-

search Department of the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation on the Yezin University Campus in Nay Pyi Taw on 5 June.

First, the President heard reports pre-

sented by Union Minister for Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation U Min Naung and officials on the production of seeds of pulse species, sunflower species and crops through the research works by the section. In response, the President highlighted that the country is currently exporting various types of pulses to international markets, including green gram, black gram, pigeon pea, chickpea, cowpea, and soybean, which meet market-quality standards. It is necessary to continuously carry out quality control and improvement of these pulses, as well as ongoing research and production efforts to enhance their value to further strengthen market access. It is important to systematically conduct research and devel-

op crop varieties. It is also necessary to further expand the production of sunflower and sesame seeds. When cultivated areas are expanded, seed production activities should be continuously conducted domestically through systematic research in order to meet the resulting seed demand. In exporting crops abroad, efforts should be made to achieve higher sales volumes even with lower profit margins per unit, it is reported.

President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing Inspects Development Undertakings in Taungoo Region

President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Min Aung Hlaing, accompanied by his wife Daw Kyu Kyu Hla, Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services General Ye Win Oo and wife, union ministers, U Khin Maung Yi, U Mya Tun Oo, U Min Naung, U Myo Zaw Thein, U Myo Thant, senior military officers from the Of-

fice of the Commander-in-Chief, deputy ministers, and officials, inspected development undertakings in and around the Taungoo area and gave necessary guidance on 6 June.

The President and party made the following activities:



- They inspected activities to upgrade Nay Pyi Taw-Taungoo railroad, to green and beautify the areas along the railroad, to grow crops, to ensure systematization of the outgoing and incoming trains at the station. He looked into the requirements presented by officials, speaking of the need to keep unused rails systematically, to improve the rail tracts that are the core of the railway services. The President also looked into other requirements.
- The President and party observed the Taungoo railway bypass construction site and new Taungoo station construction sites, and heard a report on the projects, presented by Union Minister for Transport and for Digital Development and Communications U Mya Tun Oo and officials. Regarding the reports, the President pointed out the need to erect drainage outlets and railway embankments properly and to ensure their durability in building the railway detour, to calculate the possible rise in railway services and passenger population in the future in erecting the station.
- During inspection of the Taungoo District sports ground, the President and party heard a report on the upgrading project, presented by officials of the Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs and the chief minister. In response, the President said the population of the town, the number of spectators should be taken into account in drawing the plans for the stands. He also dealt with matters relating to raising the level of the sports ground and other issues. The President then observed the stands of the sports ground and gave guidance on the upgrading project.
- The President reviewed the progress of uncovering and conserving the ancient royal palace and palace site of Taungoo Ketumati, the restoration of the western city wall near the Sin Gate, and the excavation of the city wall and silted moat



in the northern moat area. The President also observed the repair and stone reinforcement of the moat embankments, the installation of railings along the moat walkways, the laying of concrete blocks, and landscaping work carried out in the area. The Chief Minister of Bago Region and officials reported on these sites. In response to the reports, the President highlighted that the protection and conservation of the nation's historical evidence are considered a national asset. The Ketumati palace grounds, city walls, and moat are not myths but genuine ancient heritage sites with a rich historical tradition; therefore, systematic research, documentation, and preservation should be carried out. In the reconstruction of roads connected to moat bridges, efforts should be made to ensure that they remain faithful to the original historical design and are durable and sustainable in the long term and gave other necessary measures. The President and party in-

spected the walls of Ketumati city by car and left necessary instructions.

- The President visited the area near Hna-saungmyaing Village in Taungoo Township, where he observed the Department of Agriculture under the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation conducting the harvesting of summer paddy sample plots. The President also inspected the application of low-cost, easily usable natural pesticides and nutrient solutions for crops as part of soil improvement activities, as well as a demonstration of rice husk charcoal production.

The President held a meeting with district and township level departmental officials from Taungoo District of Bago Region at the hall of local airbase to talk about regional development measures. The Bago Region Chief Minister reported on the undertaking the livestock activities in the region, accomplishment of the guidance of the Head of State, cultivation of



monsoon paddy, prevention of floods, increased cultivation of oil crops and raising the oil security, Robusta coffee and vegetables, production of natural fertilizers, distribution of drum seeders, progress of livestock breeding and domestic chicken species, meat security in regions, export of products from MSME industries, efforts to develop rural socio-economic sectors, plans to grow monsoon crops in 2026-2027 financial year, and cultivation of paddy strains in monsoon. In response, the President gave necessary instructions regarding agricultural activities.

Union Minister for Construction U Myo Thant reported to the President on the formulation of the town plan to build new city of Taungoo, preparation for construction of new railway in the new city, including government offices, hospitals, schools, service facilities, resorts and greening areas. Speaking on the occasion, the President said the following points:

- By developing the Taungoo region, people

in other related areas would also be inspired and motivated to work for the development of their own regions.

- Although agriculture and livestock breeding are the main economic activities in the Taungoo region, in the long term it is necessary to promote production-based industries and MSME enterprises that are built on the agricultural and livestock sectors.
- In the Taungoo region, where rice is already sufficient, the by-products from rice production—such as bran and chaff—can be used to produce animal feed and rice bran oil.
- By utilizing the region's favourable natural resources, fish farming can also be successfully carried out in both large and small bodies of water. Furthermore, fish-based industrial production can be successfully developed.
- By successfully managing local agriculture and livestock farming, residents will be able to affordably and abundantly



ly consume various meats, fish, eggs, dairy products, vegetables, and basic food items.

- The government, in implementing national economic development, must rely on basic statistical data to formulate plans and projects. Thus, accurate and reliable baseline data must be systematically compiled and submitted by each region.
- It is also necessary to provide adequate irrigation and agricultural water.
- Consequently, all implementation efforts in each sector must be carried out with long-term benefits for the region and the nation in mind.
- Furthermore, building a developed and prosperous future nation can only be achieved through educated human resources.
- In efforts to boost the national economy, it is necessary to create job opportunities for the public and enable them to genuinely work. Only when people have jobs and can work will they earn income, leading to economic development at individual, regional, and district levels, and subsequently, national economic growth.
- The government is doing its utmost to address challenges, including the current international fuel shortages, and other basic needs to enable employment.
- In implementing regional development, continuous study is required to overcome any difficulties or crises that may arise.
- The President said he aims to implement Taungoo, Nay Pyi Taw, Yamethin, and Meikhtila as special development regions and is working toward that goal. From these regions, other towns will gradually become specially developed areas.
- Thus, efforts must be made for Taungoo, Nay Pyi Taw, Yamethin, and



Meikhtila to become exemplary special development regions. These are central and midland areas that can connect to the upper, lower, eastern, and western parts of the country. They already possess favourable land, water conditions, and good infrastructure.

- During their tenure, they must strive to be a government that leaves a lasting legacy—one that serves the interests of both the nation and its citizens.

Afterward, the President and party arrived at the Shwe Wah Chicken Farm in Kyun Kone Village, Ketumati Myothit, where entrepreneur U Ye Win and officials welcomed them. They explained the status of layer hens, the use of locally available raw materials for feed production, the use of solar electricity for the evaporated cool-

ing system, and market conditions. The President and party toured the layer hen facility using the evaporated cooling system, asked questions based on the officials' explanations, and provided necessary advice, reports say.

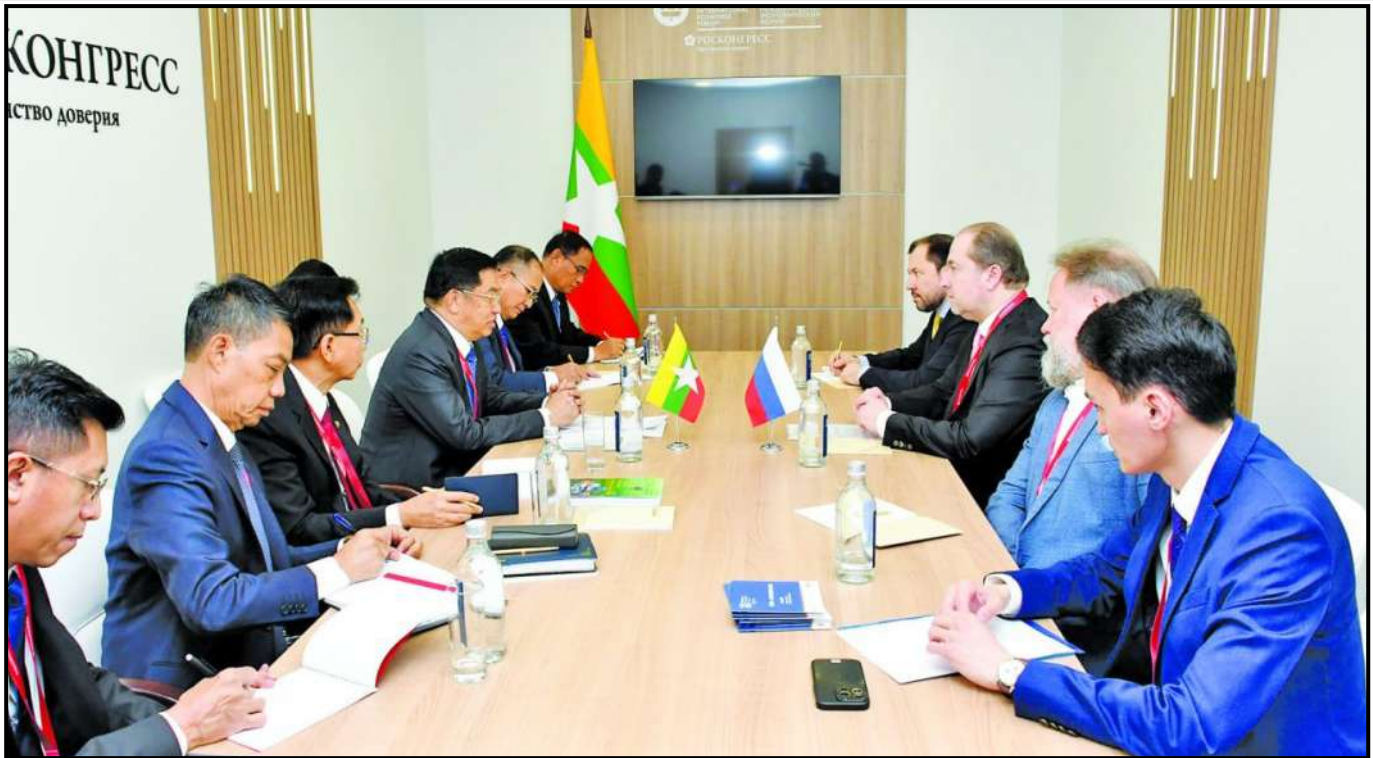

Third-day Meeting of Second Regular Session of Third Pyithu Hluttaw Continued



The third-day meeting of the second regular session of the Third Pyithu Hluttaw continued at its convention hall at the Hluttaw Complex in Nay Pyi Taw on 5 June.

funded dams (Nhan Taw, Kya Khat, Zee Yaing, and Kyauk Se Seik) in Kutoseik Village-tract, Pyinmana Township, to provide sufficient irrigation water for local farmers.

- The Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker sought approval for the formation of a local and foreign non-governmental committee and its duties, authorities, rights, term and committee meetings, and the Hluttaw agreed to it. 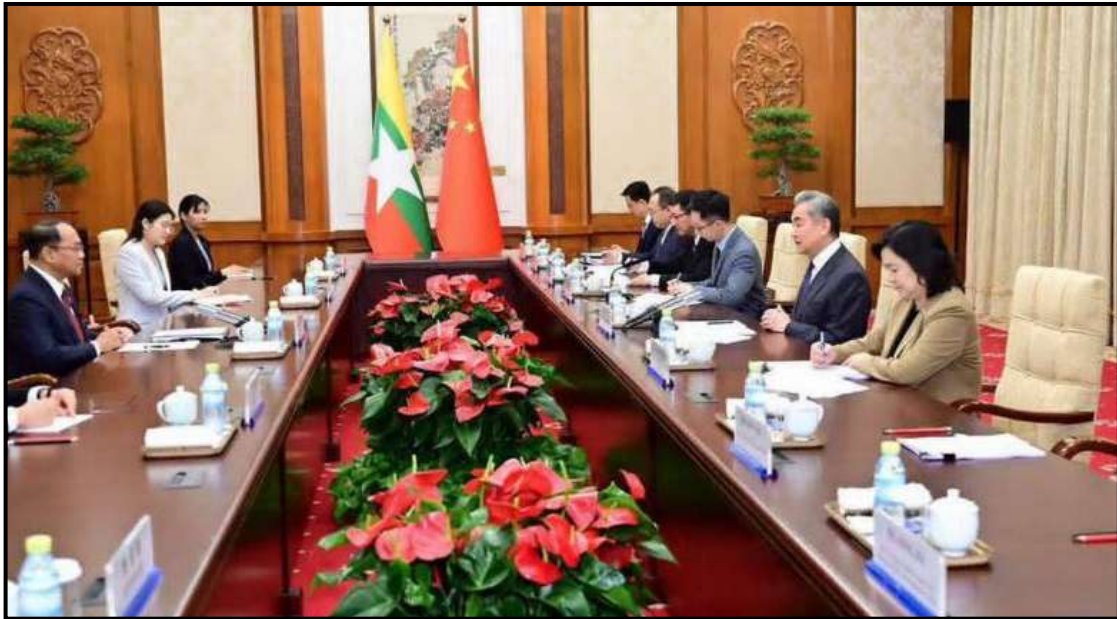

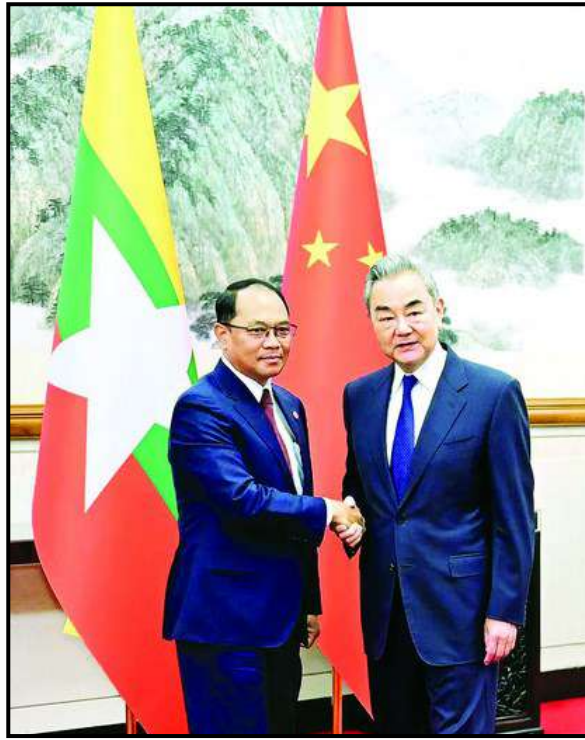

Demolition of Additional Illegal Buildings used for Online Scam and Gambling Operations in Shwe Kokko Area Continues

Demolition of Illegal Buildings in Shwe Kokko Area, Myawady District, Kayin State



The Myanmar Government has set to demolish 77 illegal buildings in Shwe Kokko Area and KK Park. The buildings have been categorized: 57 buildings will be demolished using heavy machinery, and 20 buildings will be destroyed by controlled explosions. Among the 57 designated buildings for demolition, nine additional three-storey buildings were demolished using heavy machinery on 4-7 June. Therefore, 42 buildings altogether have been demolished.

Demolition will continue on the remaining illegal 35 buildings in order. The

Government will collaborate not only with local forces but also with the governments of neighbouring countries to prevent online scam and online gambling operations in Myanmar, assuming the effort as a national responsibility, reports say.

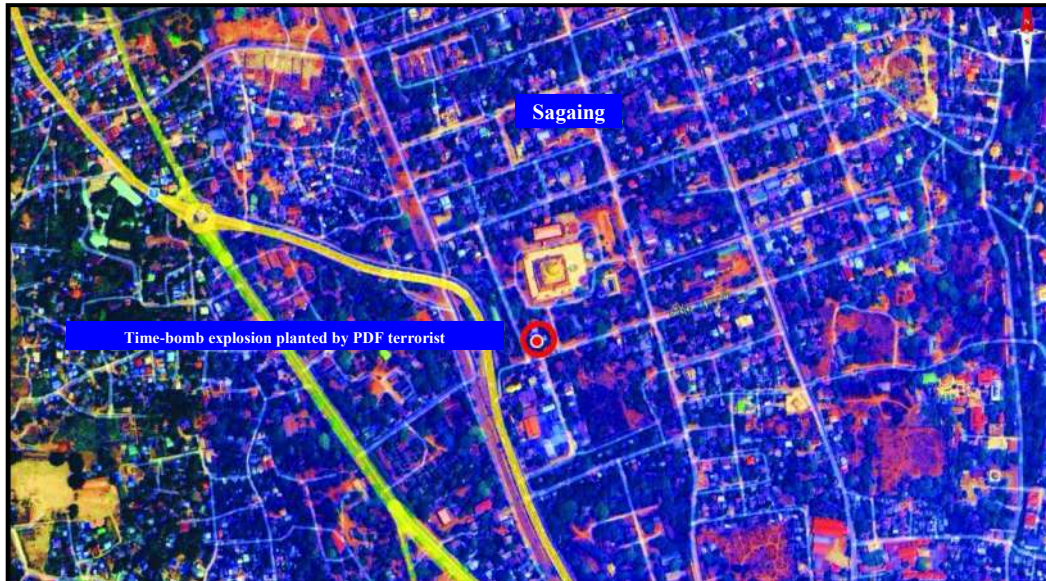

PDF Terrorists Launch Time-Bomb Attack on Sagaing Township Immigration Department Office



Under the Government's La Min Project, the Township Immigration Office in Parami Ward, Sagaing Township, Sagaing Region, is working the issuance of Citizenship Scrutiny Cards (CSCs) to eligible citizens aged 18 and above who have not yet received a CSC for various reasons, as well as to students aged 10 and above, in accordance with the law. At the same time, the collection of Unique IDs through the e-ID system is being undertaken on an accelerated basis.

While the said-activities were underway on 5 June, terrorists launched a time-bomb attack on the Township Immigration and Population Department Office. According to reports, six office staff members on duty and 13 innocent civilians who had come to apply for CSCs sustained shrapnel injuries as a result of the blast, bringing the

total number of injured to 19. Such terrorist attack also caused damage to office rooms and official documents.

PDF terrorist insurgents carried out attacks targeting unarmed civilians in areas where residents were living peacefully and unrelated to military activities, resulting in casualties and damage to civilian life and property. Such incidents have drawn strong public condemnation. Security forces are continuing investigations into the incidents and are working in coordination with responsible local residents to identify and apprehend those involved. Efforts are underway to ensure that the terrorist insurgents responsible for the reported acts are brought to justice in accordance with the law, reports say.

On 6 June, a Grade-11 student was injured when PDF terrorists wantonly opened fire on teachers, students, and local residents participating in a voluntary school clean-up and beautification activity at Basic Education High School (Kyawe) in Kyawe Township, Gangaw District, Magway Region. The terrorists reportedly fired small arms from a railway crossing located approximately 220 meters south-east of the school compound. During the incident, The Grade-11 student sustained a gunshot wound that entered through the right side of the chest and exited through the back.
